## February Floop Clean up -

Despite a very dubious weather forecast, an impressive 11 volunteers showed up and got stuck into clearing the litter from around The Quadrants and then eastwards up to Longford Road. Thank goodness that Victor had previously spotted a large dump of expanded polystyrene packaging near Longford Road and was able to clear this before it got blown around and shredded into a thousand pieces!

After returning to The Quadrants for a refreshment break, we headed in the other direction and this will be remembered as the time Liz made a bid for freedom and had to be called back with a mobile phone call! (I almost got as far as Slade Lane bridge – got a bit over-enthusiastic!) Our tally for the day was 36 bags of rubbish which were collected by the Council the next day. Thanks to Emma Krinjen-Kemp at the Council for facilitating this new arrangement.

# February Yellow Brick Road (Old Stockport Canal) Clean up -

Storm Dennis was due to sweep the country over the weekend but I decided on Friday that we should go ahead with the litter pick anyway. If only a few showed up, that would be fine. However this was to underestimate the amazing commitment of the regulars (mostly Canal Society volunteers). In the event, there were eight of us raring to get stuck in despite the weather. We started at Sexa St (near the canal) and cleared the entrance and the path up to the canal and even part of the adjoining park area which was in a dreadful state. The littering was very bad - we removed 49 bags in total - and so when I got home I checked when we had last cleared it. This turned out to be 9 months ago and illustrates the problem of concentrating on the busy Debdale end of the path at the cost of neglecting the quieter, and in my opinion, nicer canal end.

#### The GB Spring Clean campaign
